

Goddard remains number one in Intercenter Fun Run

A record 300 people completed two miles on Goddard's part in the 16th Intercenter Fun Run last month. That hearty participation and the placing of 37 runners in top-10 age and sex categories helped Goddard retain its #1 position among NASA centers.

Ames finished second in the 2-mile event while Langley claimed third place.
