

## Goddard Photography Club Flickr Site

Viewing images is easy. No account or login is needed. Just use the link above.

Uploading: To upload images, you will need to log in. While you are logged in, please be careful not to unintentionally change existing pictures.

To log in:

1. If you use Yahoo Messenger, you may need to log out first. (Flickr is actually run by Yahoo, and there is a login conflict)
2. Go to the link above, and click on "Sign In" in the upper right corner.
3. On the sign in window, click on the Google link near the bottom, on the right.
4. Fill in the following: contact Scott Hull for user name and password. Members only! PLEASE PROTECT THIS PASSWORD, SINCE IT IS THE "KEYS" TO THE SITE.
5. That will take you to the 'photostream' page, which shows all photos on the site, in the reverse order they were uploaded. The area on the right shows the 'sets', into which photos are organized.
6. Click on "Upload" near the top, in the center. The instructions are pretty straightforward from there.
7. Click on "Choose photos and videos". Browse your computer to find the pictures to upload. You can upload pictures for several sets at once. Please don't upload big video files(>30 MB) early in the month, since we only get 300 MB per month.
8. In most cases, leave the "Public" spot checked under privacy. Click Upload.
9. It is recommended to go ahead and click "add a description" at this point.
10. Type in the description in the big box. Then use the pulldown menu under "Add to a set" to select an existing set, or "Create a new Set..." to create a new one if nothing applicable exists.
11. You can add captions to any photo by clicking on 'Edit Photo' under the image. Remember to add your name to each photo caption, so we'll know who took it..
12. Click "Save".
13. While logged in, you have the ability to edit yours and other sets, descriptions, etc, so please be a little careful. You may find useful tools under the "Organize & Create" tab near the top left. For example, you might want to designate on a map where the photos were taken (the Visitor Center and Club Observatory are already on the map, and easy to add to).
14. Click "Sign Out" when you are done.
15. For those people worried about controlling permissions for download, etc: The default permission is set to "Attribution-NonCommercial-ShareAlike" as described here: <http://creativecommons.org/licenses/>. If you want to change it for any given photo, you can do so by dragging the photo(s) into the batch processing area, and using the 'Permissions' pulldown menu. You can set to all rights reserved, if you wish to prevent downloads.
