*Thursday*

After leaving the slopes, many people took a dip in the hot tub and/or pool. Then there was an Après Ski Party with snacks and wine in the party room next to the pool.






The party lasted from until about 8:00 p.m. when about half of the group headed to the Cascades Lodge Restaurant for dinner.
